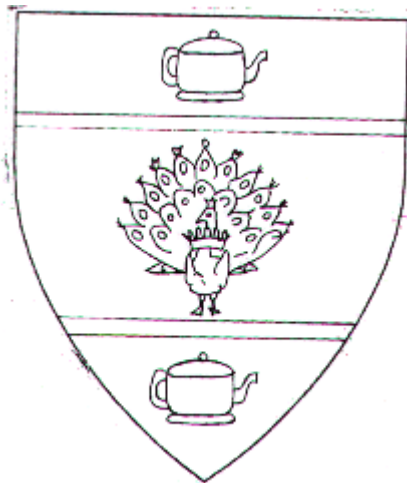

vert.*

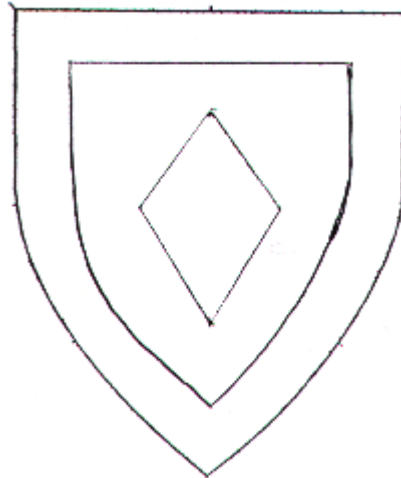
Documentation supporting the submitters use of the coronet are attached, the submitter is a Court Baron awarded 29 May 2000 in Ealdormere. Also attached is a document to support the use of the teapot as this is believed to be the first such item registered in the society. A synopsis of this documentation shows the teapot coming to Europe from China in the first half of the 16th Century and examples from Syria around the 10th century.

Or a lozenge and a bordure purpure.

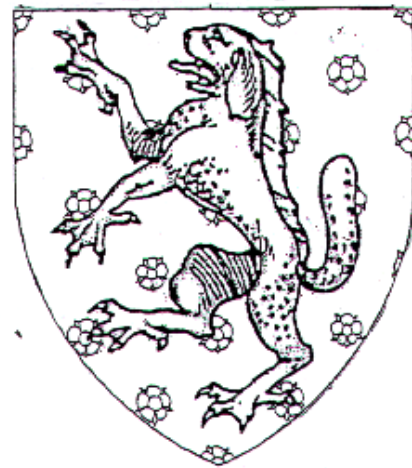
3. James Erec of York (Device Change, name



registered 11/92 Middle)

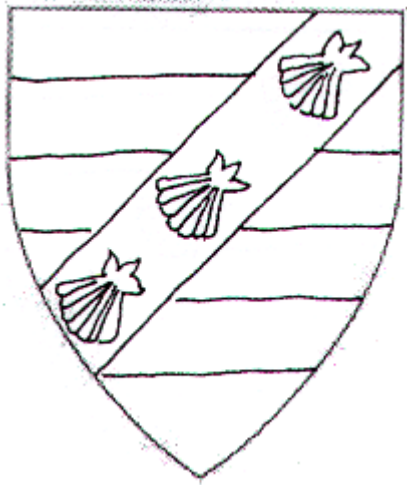
*Gules, semi of roses Or, a sea dog rampant
