1. **Cerie Wreic Daniel** (New Name, New Device)

Gules, a cross florie argent, on a chief argent three wolves leaping gules.

Cerie – daughter of Brychan of Brecknock, 5th C. Welsh king

Wreic – Tangwystl (“wife of”-Welsh)

Daniel – Hebrew Bible: Book of Daniel

2. **Daniel of Whitby** (New name, New Device)

Gules, upon a bend argent, three arrows in bend sable between two wolves rampant argent.

Daniel – Hebrew Bible: Book of Daniel (also submitter’s mundane name)

Whitby – Synod of Whitby 664 AD

3. **Diogenia Melanesi** (New Name, New Device, New Badge)

Or, a bull salient gules, on a chief embattled purpure an open book Or.

Melanesi – “Family Names Appearing in the Catasto of Florence, 1427” (www.s-gabriel.org/names/ferrante/catasto/family-names.html)

4. **Kaellyn mac Dermott** (Registered as Kaellyn mac Dermott of Leinster Aug 1989 Middle, New Device)

Azure embattled argent, a winged cat argent

Better blazon would be:

Azure, a winged cat, an embattled bordure argent

5. **Kolbjorn skattkaupandi** (New Name, New Device)

Argent, a python erect contourney wings addorsed, a bordure purpure.

6. **Liadan Cu Teach Cairdeas** (Kingdom Name resubmission, New Device)

Argent, three teazels vert between two trefoil knots Or in the flanks purpure.

Liadan – Academy of St. Gabriel report 1665 – early Irish saint, nun and poet.

Argent, mailed sable on an argent bend sinister thrice three annulets gules interlaced.

Normand – Behind the name: English name

Norman, Normand is a derivative; Reaney and Wilson sn. Norman, Normand, cites Reginaldus filius Normandi c. 1220

Hauberker – Hauberker: J.R. Dolan, *Book of*

Ancestral Names; SCA registration through

Meridies (to bake was to be a Baker, to make hauberker was to be a Hauberker)

8. **Rustique de Sorde** (Registered as Rustique de Suard Apr 1997 Middle, New Badge)

Purpure on a bend counter embattled argent a heart fracted sable.

9. **Teach Cairdeas** (Kingdom household name and badge resubmission)

Per chevron argent, azure and gules nombril wagon wheel argent

Teach (pronounced tea-ock) Irish “house”;

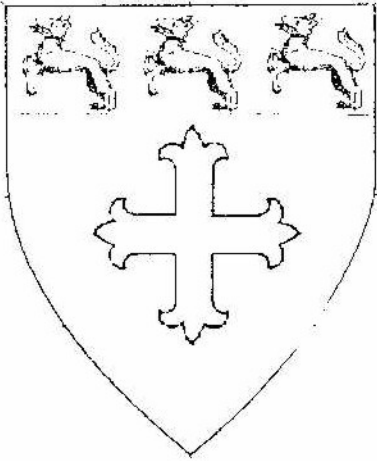
Cairdeas (pronounced tcare-daw) Irish
