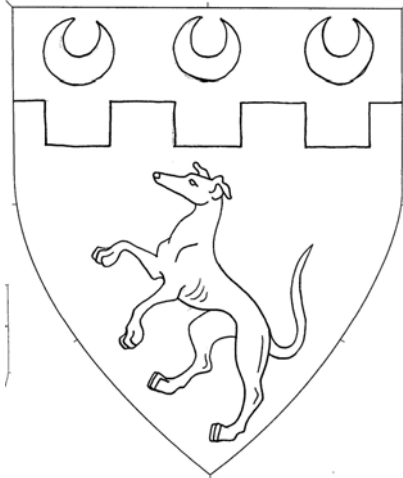

1. **Alana Greywood** (Device Resubmission at Kingdom – Name submitted on July ELoI, Device returned from June ILoI)

Argent a greyhound rampant gules on a chief embattled sable three crescents argent.

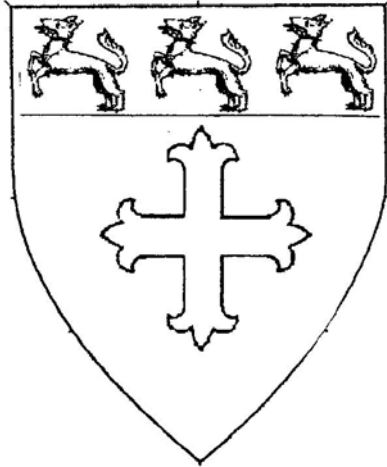


at Kingdom – previous submissions from June 03 ILoI) – seeking female name authentic to language/culture of 16th century Scotland.

2. **Catriona inghen Raghnaill** (Name and Device resubmission)

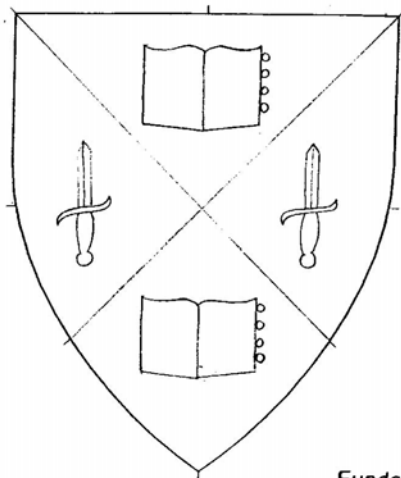


3. **Ealdormere, Kingdom of - Order of the Trillium** (New Order/Award) – Seeking Authentic to sound.

4. **Eleanor of Huntingdon** (Device resubmission at Kingdom 04/2004 ILoI – Name registered in Middle 10/98)

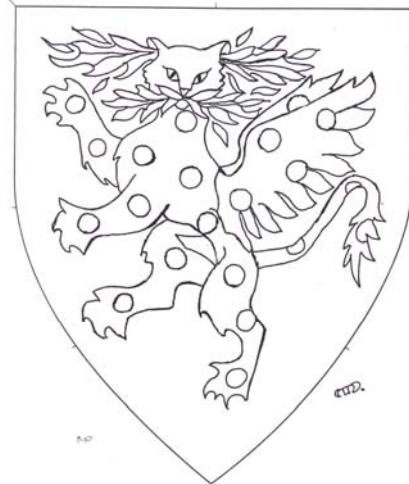
Per saltire argent and vert two daggers sable and two open books in cross.

5. **Gwendolynn ferch Elydyr**
 (New Device – submitter releases previous registered device “Ermine a winged panther rampant regardant sable bezanty incensed proper” should this submission be successful) Name appears on the Feb/91 LOAR via the Middle, Device on the Apr/94 LOAR via the Middle.

Argent, a winged panther rampant guardant sable bezanty incensed proper.



6. **Gwendolynn ferch Elydyr**
 (New Badge)

(Fieldless) A winged continental panther sejant contourney sable incensed proper.

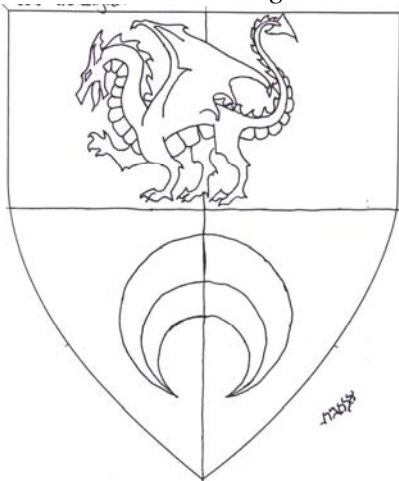


7. **Gwydion Merther** (New Name and Device) Wishes a male name with the sound, language and culture of Wales.

Gwydion – from Jones : “A Welsh Miscellany”, Men’s Given Names P31, col. 2 (CA #66)

Merther – found in Echwall, dated as Merthersithun to 1230; it says “Merther is identical with Merthyr in wales, which is Welsh merthyr “martyr”: “(the church of) the martyr.”

Quarterly vert and argent in pale a dragon passant or and an inverted crescent counterchanged.

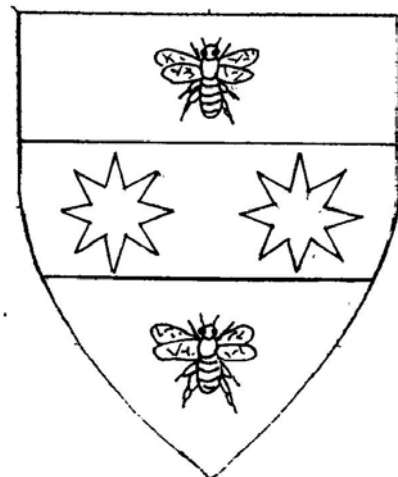


8. **Jullienne LaRousseaux** (New Name and Device) – Seeking female name authentic to French and caring about meaning.

Attached are copies of Given Names from Brittany, 1384-1600 from www.s-gabriel.org/names/tangwystyl/latebraton as well as a copy of the Black Pillar Pursuivant’s Internal letter of Comment, Kingdom of Artemisia dated July 24, 2003. This sites Rousseau++ (some –aux, -eaud, -eaux) as a widespread derivation of “de la Roux” – French byname [Dauzat, dictionnaire etymologizue des names de famille et prenomms de France, 1987 reprint, pp530-31 s.n. Roux]

Client further specifies meaning: The colour red or of red.

Azure between two bees proper in pale on a fess or two mullets of eight of the first.



9. **Kersteken Janzdochtere** (New Name and Device) – Seeking a female name authentic in language/culture for 14th-15th century Dutch. WILL NOT accept MAJOR changes

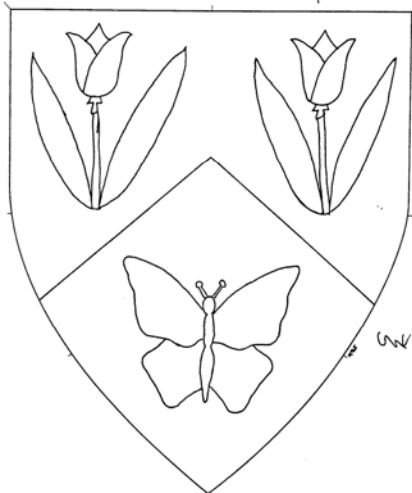

Per chevron or and argent 2 tulips gules slipped and leaved vert a butterfly displayed azure.

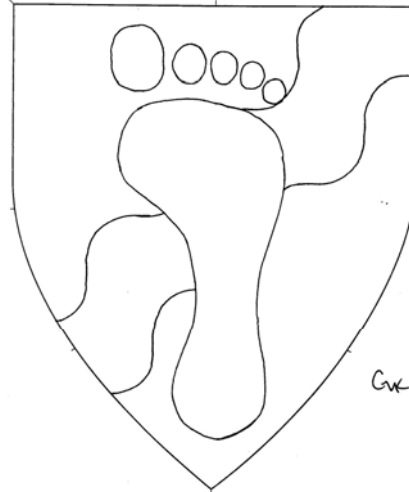


10. **Magnunnr Hringsdottir** (New Name and Device) – Seeking female specific name. WILL NOT accept MAJOR or MINOR changes.

Magnunnr – constructed feminine given name. Magn – Lind (Dipnamn) p753 on Magnhildr dates women with forms of the name magnhildr to 1288 to 1501 incl magnildr 1288-90. Unnr – Lind (Dopnamn) lists woman’s names containing this element including Steinunnr p959, Ingunnr p642, Unnr p1062. Multiple dated forms of each of these names dated pre-1600 are given in these entries. Geirr Bassi lists names with these elemtnes Iorhildr p16, Iorunn p16, Steinunn p15, Ingunn p12.

Hringsdottir – Geirr Bassi p11 lists the masculine name Hringr.

Argent a bend wavy sinister sable overall a human footprint gules.



11. **Mairghread Plonced** (New Name and Device) - Seeking a female name authentic to language/culture of 15th-16th century Irish.

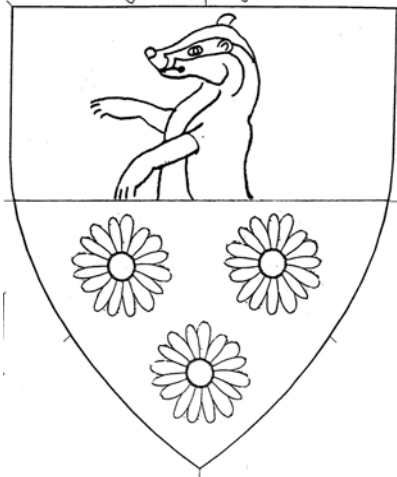

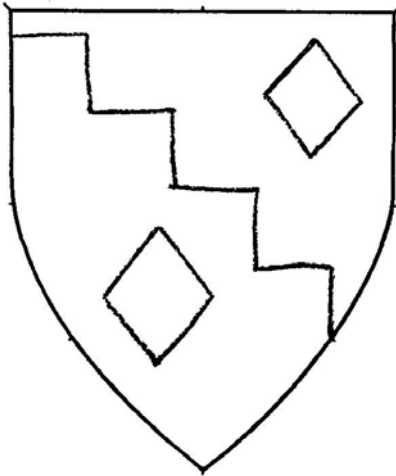

Per fess argent and purpure a badger rampant sable issuant from the line of division and in base three marguerite daisies argent.



12. **May de la Wold** (Device Resubmission at Kingdom 04/2004 ILoI)

Per bend dancetty azure and vert two lozenges argent.



13. **Meurug Taylor** (New Name and Device) – Seeking female name authentic to sound “Morag Taylor”. Will not accept MAJOR changes.

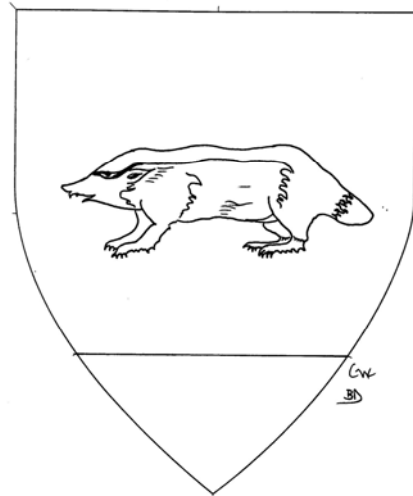
Will accept Morag in any language/spelling – sound most important.

Taylor – R&W s.n. Taylor p440; dated spelling Taylur c.1180.

Morag – Withycombe s.n Morag p222, undated “Gaelic diminutive of Mor(a)”, the sun.

Meurug – Morgan & Murgan sn Meurig, state “Generally, when I and u or u (eu) and I follow each other, the first vowel (or diphthong) yields to the second and takes over it’s quality. The reverse may happen occasionally so that Meurig may become Meurug, WG112. This must be regarded as exceptional for the examples in most cases show ig, ic.” Gruffudd, sn Meurig p72 dates Meurig c.850.

Argent, a badger statant sable marked argent a base gules.



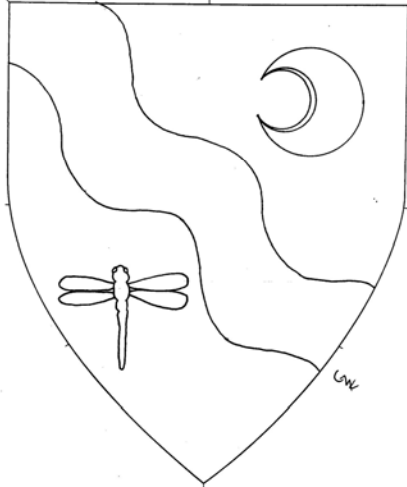
14. **Neamh inghean Fhearghail** (New Name and Device) – seeks female name authentic to sound.

Neamh – OCM, s.n. Nem lists it as a m & f name, name of a saint and daughter of a saga hero. This is post 1200 form.

Inghean – daughter of **Fearghail** – OCM, s.n. Fergal, notes it as an extremely popular name and notes Fearghail as a late period genitive form. Lenited according to

standard rules (Lenitim step by step).
Early spelling: Nem ingen Fergail

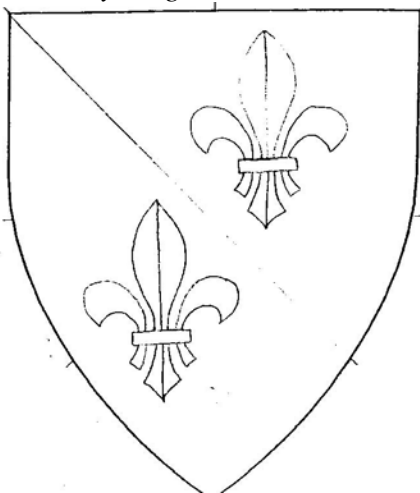
Per bend purpure and azure a bend wavy between an increscent and a dragonfly argent.



15. **Odette de Saint Remy** (New Name and Device) – Seeking a female name authentic in language/culture to 16th century France.

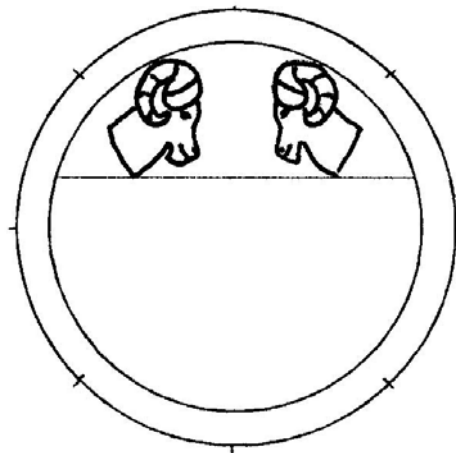
Purpure per bend sinister azure two fleur de lys argent.



16. **Ramshaven, Barony of - Award of the Guidon de Sang** – (New Order/Award Name and Badge)

This award is an entry level award currently being given out in Ramshaven in the form of a Pennant which can then have the recipient's own arms added into the white space on the pennant. As an individual becomes more accomplished they may be recognized by the Barony in the form of the Guidon d'Argent (second level) conferring the right to add a silver bordure, then with the Guidon d'Or (third level) conferring the right to add a Gold bordure.

Argent, on a chief gules two rams heads combatant argent within a bordure gules.

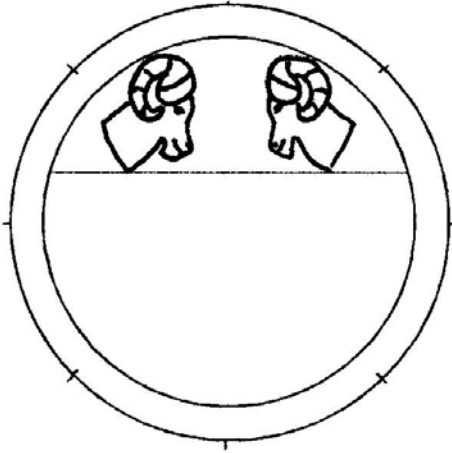


17. **Ramshaven, Barony of - Award of the Guidon d'Argent** – (New Order/Award and Badge)

This award is the second level Guidon, conferring the right to add a silver bordure to the recipient's Guidon de Sang. As the individual becomes more accomplished they may be recognized by the barony in

the form of the Guidon d'Or (third level) conferring the right to add a gold bordure.

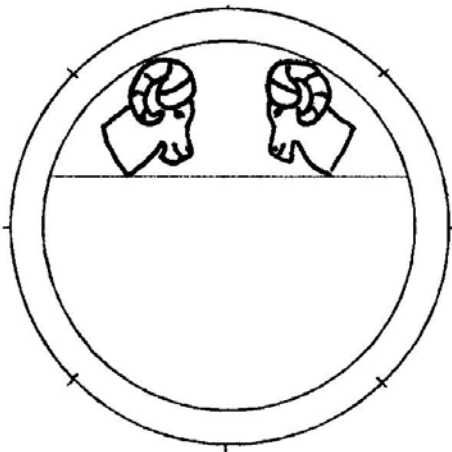
Argent, on a chief gules two rams heads combatant argent within a bordure argent.



18. Ramshaven, Barony of - Award of the Guidon d'Or –
(New Order/Award and Badge)

This award is the third level Guidon, conferring the right to add a gold bordure to the recipient's Guidon d'Argent.

Argent, on a chief gules two rams heads combatant argent within a bordure or.



19. Ramshaven, Barony of - Award of the Favour of Ramshaven –
(New Order/Award and Badge)

No documentation attached

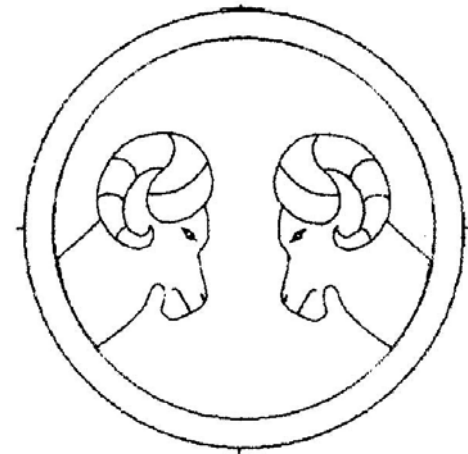
Gules, a ram's head cabossed Or, within a bordure argent.



20. Ramshaven, Barony of - Award of the Jewel of Ramshaven –
(New Order/Award and Badge)

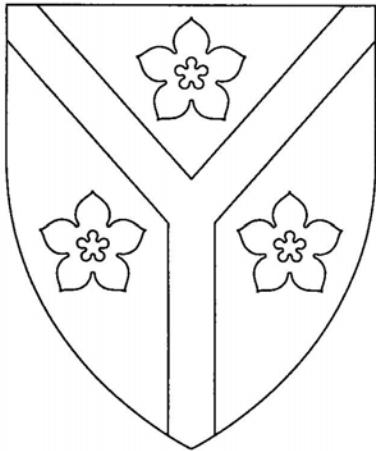

 (New Device Submission – submitter releases previous registered device “Argent, a pall arrondy between three forget-me-nots azure.” Should this submission be successful) Name appears on the 04/94 LOAR via the Middle.

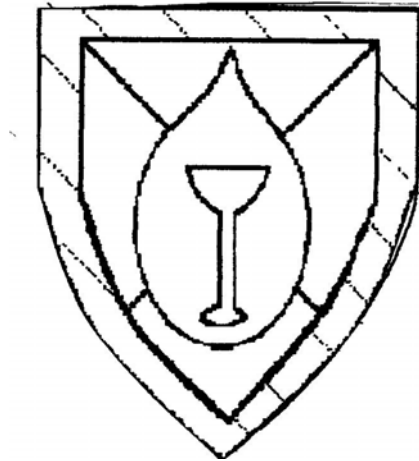
Or, a pall between three forget-me-not flowers azure

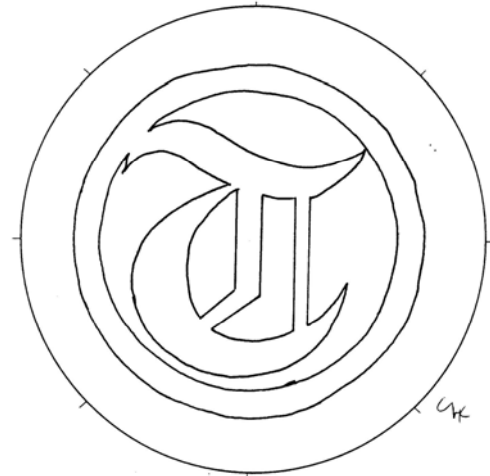

23. **Tangwystl D’Curci** (New Badge)

Sable, a gothic capital letter T within and conjoined in chief to an annulet or.
