Internal Letter of Intent

June 2006

Unto Excellent Trillium, the Ealdormere College of Heraldry and commenting heralds everywhere does Lady Cainder inghean Hui Chatharnaig, Green Mantle Herald, send warm greetings and well wishes. The following items are presented for your commentary and suggestions prior to our submission for registration with the SCA College of Heraldry.

\*In all cases unless indicated otherwise, submitters will accept all changes and creation of holding names as required for their desired authenticity.

1. **Adriella Kerrick** – New Name and New Device. *Lozengy purpure and argent, a fox rampant sable and on a chief argent two mullets of eight sable.* Client will not accept major changes. She cares more about the sound and a feminine gendered name.

Adriella – St. Gabriel Report #1528 lists <Adria> as a third century saint.

“Feminine Names from the Thirteenth Century Perugia” [www.s-gabriel.org/names/arval/perugia/gerugiaFemAlpha.html](http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/arval/perugia/gerugiaFemAlpha.html) includes several names with the <-ella> diminutive. <Brunella> from Mbruna; <Consolella> from <Consola>; <Munaldella> from <Munaldescha>; <Rosanella> from <Rosana>. Therefore <Adriella> is a reasonable constructed Italian Name.

Kerrick – Reaney & Wilson, s.n. <Kerrich>; <Kerrick> 1330

As per the September 1999 LoAR (s.n. Veronica de Halloway) Italian and English is a registerable “weirdness”.



2. **Alexander the Blue** – New Name and New Device. *Per fess argent and azure two dragons rampant and three triskellions counterchanged.* Client cares only that it is a male name.

The Blue – Black’s Surnames of Scotland pg 83 <Blue>



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3. **Gillian of Ravenglass** – New Name. Client cares only that this be a feminine name. She also gives permission to Reynard de Folche and Ariadne Athingani to conflict with the “Ravenglass” part of this name.

The top 50 women’s names listed by Scott Smith-Bannister for the 1560’s and the 1570’s follow this trend fairly well. In approximate order, they are:…<Gillian>

“Feminine names from Devon, 1238” by Sara L. Uckelman (SCA: Aryanhwy merch Catmael) 2004

The following list of feminine names is from Summerson, Hendry, ed., Crown pleas of the Devon Eyre of 1238…<Gillian> appears 4 times.

Ravenglass - “Map of Roman Britain” 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition, Ordnance Survey, Chessington, Surrey, England 1956 – shows the location of Glannaventa or Ravenglass.

“English Heritage Guide” – Historic Buildings and Monuments Commission for England  
Ravenglass: Roman Bath House includes the standing remains of bath house originally belonging to the Roman fort at Ravenglass.

4. **Jaqueline de Bucquoy** – New Name and New Device. *Quarterly argent and purple, a cross flory and four trilliums counterchanged.* Client cares more about the language/culture of Northern France (Pas-de-Calais) and wishes a feminine name authentic to the language/culture of Northern France if possible.

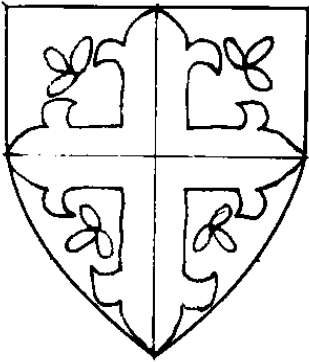

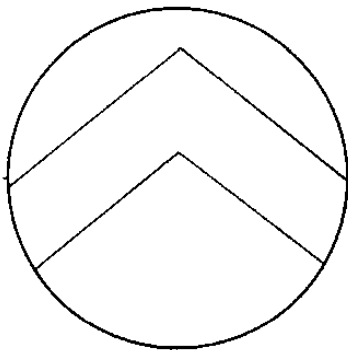
Records from the Municipal Archives of Leiden list 47 volumes of marriage bans beginning in 1575 and ending in 1795. The bans of people from the Lille are noted from 1575 to 1710.

Issue 25, p53: <Lawys de Buckoy>, a young man from Turcoyn (Tourcoing), accompanied by Antony de Buckoy, his father.

On December 31, 1588 to <Martijne Bodijn>, a young woman from Armentieres, accompanied by Maria Pronye, her mother and Antonette Bodijn her sister (B, 77v). Issue 25, p53: <Jheremias de Bucquoy>, a young man from Leiden passementier, accompanied by PieterBodeyn, his grandfather and Olivier de Bucquoy, his uncle. On November 21, 1611 to <Proontgen van den Camere>, young woman from Turcoigen (Tourcoing), accompanied by Sara de Kan, Philippotte de Band, her cousine (G,129). Issue 83, p.605: This is a query that was posted by a Jean Degobert. It reads like this: 1986/396: Bodin-Prony (Prouy)(Armentieres -59). Origine et ascendance de la famille BODIN (Boidin) Pierre Boidin x Marie Prony et leurs enfants se fixant vers 1580 a Leyde en Hollande (passage par Cantorbery en Angleterre) Parmi liers enfants, Pierre, Martine et Antoinette. Antoinette x Gabriel Hannedoucke. Boidin et d'Armentieres et un Luis de Bucquoy de Tourcoing.

5. **Liadin Chu** – New Badge. – *Azure and gules, a chevron argent.* Client's name was registered Nov. 03.



6. **Llywelyn Williams** - Resubmission of Name and Device. \*Name was previously returned for lack of reliable sources adequate to source. The device was also returned at Kingdom level as there were questions regarding adequate contrast and what the primary charge on the device was. *Per chevron rayonny overall, argent and vert, three crows maintaining bows within a bordure all counterchanged.* Client cares most about the Welsh language/culture between 1400 and 1500's and prefers an authentic male name if possible.

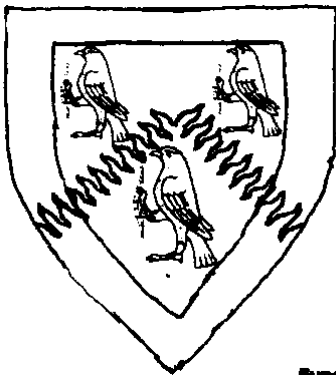

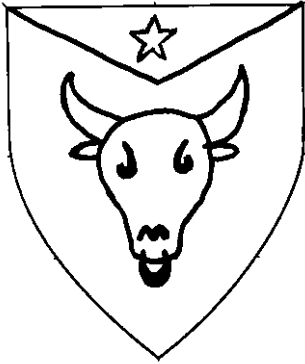
7. **Mario of Chelsea** – New Name and New Device. *Argent, a bull's head caboshed gules and on a triangular chief azure, a mullet of five Or.* Client will not accept major or minor changes, cares most about a male name authentic for 12<sup>th</sup> –15<sup>th</sup> century.

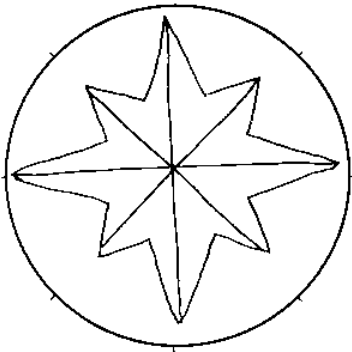

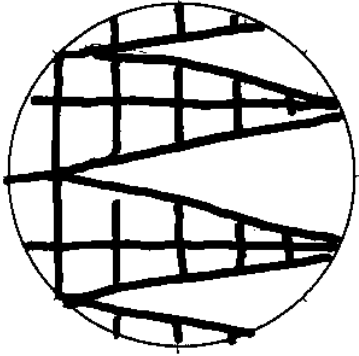

8. **Mateo de Merida** – Resubmission of Badge. *Gules, a compass star gyronny argent and sable.* Client's name was registered Oct 05 and the badge was previously returned at Kingdom (Apr 06) due to lack of contrast. The clients shuffling of colours and redraw of the defining lines should clear any previous problems.



9. **Ulvar Van Der Nederlander** – New Badge. *Chequey argent and gules, three piles fesswise issuant from sinister sable.* Client's name was registered June 1994 via Middle.

Contained herein are: 5 New Names, 4 New Devices, 2 New Badges, 1 Name Resubmission, 1 Device Resubmission and 1 Badge Resubmission, resulting in 14 total submissions.
